 "This is what you said, Author" SURFACE INFORMATION The Lines: State the information and ideas, the evidence and clues actually stated. Show a clear grasp of the information the author provides. List the seemingly important points, those that make you ask, "Why are you telling me this?" List the clues here. 	 "This is what I infer, Author" BRIDGING INFERENCES Between the Lines: Is this what you are suggesting from the stated information? What can I infer because of the ideas and concepts that are in close proximity? What are the reasons they are close together? Do you want me to relate the distant parts to each other? How? Why? What is the big message of your text? the theme? What are you hoping I'll infer from this? List your inferences here. 	 "This is what I predict, Author" and the "So what?" ELABORATIVE INFERENCES Beyond the Lines: This is where I think you are headed (prediction) and my evidence. What from my own experience or prior knowledge contributes to or supports this inference? What might be the consequences of believing and acting on this information? Make predictions and play with the ideas here.
